The formation of Joint Boarder Committee is the milestones towards reducing cost of doing business in Tanzania by solving administrative or regulatory bureaucracy. It aims at making regulatory Authorities at border post working in a team to facilitate fast human and cargo cross the border. It a one steps towards implementing One Stop Border Post initiatives between customs authority in East Africa Community and as finally achieving single customs clearance system.

Q3: LONG DESCRIPTION OF THE CASE STORY

The Government of Tanzania with the support from US-COMPETE initiated in 2010 and has been successful in setting up seven out of fourteen Joint Border Committee (JBCs) already established at key transit border posts in the East Africa Community Region. The Operation of Joint Border Committee (JBCs) is based on the domestic Border Post Integration (DBPI) concept, which is premised on establishment of team work and close working relations amongst all border agencies in one country offering a single package of services to its clients who are importers and exporters of goods and services who cross the particular border post.

Initially the financing of such committee was by the government of Tanzania through the Ministry of Industry and Trade. Efforts are made to enact a law so that their operation becomes mandates and the government allocate direct budget for their operation.
