## Q1: TITLE OF CASE STORY

Integrated Regional Project for Progressive Control of Foot-and-Mouth Disease in Peru, Bolivia, Ecuador, Colombia and Venezuela

### Q2: CASE STORY ABSTRACT

Translation DB: Strengthening of National Veterinary Services. Some countries do not have the capacity or technical know-how, the necessary infrastrastructure and equipment necessary, nor trained or specialized personnel to make progress in the eradication [of foot-and-mouth disease]. It is estimated that countries invest US\$380 M in the control of foot-and-mouth disease an amout which, if foot-and-mouth were eradicated, could be targeted to other priority activities.

### **Q3: LONG DESCRIPTION OF THE CASE STORY**

Translation DB: A request has been made to the FAO by the ANDEAN Community for the establishment of a national regional strategy to complement and coordinate national, border and regional efforts against foot-and-mouth disease. FAO has been charged with channelling resources from the Spanish Cooperation and the Italian Cooperation.

Objective:

To provide CAN and Venezuela with the capacity to respond to foot-and-mouth disease and improved level of coordination and harmonization of Foot-and-Mouth Programmes at the regional level. Components:

Regional coordination and harmonization: development of COTASA's technical strategies and mechanisms to revise national and community regulations.

Management capacity of veterinary services: development of systems and mechanisms for sustainable management of resources and eradication programmes (public/private partnership, investment projects, public policy instruments.

Technical capacities to mitigate risk: technical strengthening of national Foot-and-Mouth programmes according to what stage of the disease the country is up against. Progfressive Control of foot-and-mouth. Awareness and media education: information campaigns aimed at supporting prevention, control and eradication [of foot-and-mouth] in the bovine production chain.

Technical and operational support of the proejct: technical and operational support of regional project. First phase ended on 30 June 2014. A new phase is expected to be initiated for 2015-2017.

Ecuador has currently been without new outbreaks of foot-and-mouth for about 41 months.
