- 2- Commercial traders will be able to electronically submit information to comply with customs and other government regulations for border related decisions, minimizing the requirement for paper forms in the import process.

Q3: LONG DESCRIPTION OF THE CASE STORY

The Republic of Togo has awarded a concession to Bureau Veritas BIVAC and his partner, Soget to install and run a sophisticated system which is a facility that allows parties involved in trade and logistics to lodge standardized information and documents with a single point of entry to fulfill all foreign trade operations related requirements.

"The Single Window is part of our strategy to attract more international trade, reinforce the local economy and improve our position in the World Bank's competitive index, Doing Business". A particularly innovative billing system lies at the heart of the new Togolese Single Window whereby all payments and transactions are listed on one single document enabling costs and taxes to be monitored more efficiently.

The contract was signed on the 10/10/2013 with Bureau Verita BIVAC and his partner, Soget to install and run the single window. The project started at the end of 2013 and was in full service by the end of 2014.
