

The ACN supports countries in Eastern Europe and Central Asia<sup>1</sup> in their fight against corruption, by providing a regional forum for promotion of anti-corruption activities, exchange of information, elaboration of best practices and donor coordination.

- to take stock of the lessons learnt from the implementation of the *Istanbul Anti-Corruption Action Plan* on the occasion of its  $10^{th}$  anniversary;
- to adopt the Istanbul Action Plan third round of monitoring reports on Azerbaijan and Georgia and discuss the progress reports by Armenia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Ukraine and Uzbekistan;
- to discuss the implementation of the ACN Work Programme 2013-2015, in particular the ACN Cross-Country Thematic Studies.

# Bilateral consultations between the monitoring team, the Secretariat and Azerbaijan and Georgia to discuss the draft third round monitoring report

\*\*\* Bilateral consultations are <u>open only</u> to the monitoring teams, the Secretariat and delegations of Azerbaijan and Georgia. Other delegates can participate in these sessions with the agreement of the monitoring team and the monitored country.\*\*\*

The *first bilateral consultations* include: presentation of the main conclusions of the draft monitoring team; presentation of the proposed changes by the delegation of the monitored country; discussion of the proposed changes and inclusion of agreed changes in the draft report; and identification of outstanding issues where no agreement was reached for the presentation at the plenary meeting.

The *second bilateral consultations* consist of: discussion of the outstanding issues identified by the plenary with the aim to develop an agreed text of assessment, ratings and new recommendations, and to present them in track changes mode for the plenary; and identification of unresolved issues to be presented for the discussion in the plenary.

### Roundtable on the occasion of the Istanbul Anti-Corruption Action Plan 10th Anniversary

At the occasion of its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the roundtable aims to take stock of the lessons learnt and ways ahead of the Istanbul Anti-Corruption Action Plan.

The keynote speakers will highlight the progress achieved in Eastern Europe and Central Asia and the remaining challenges identified in the new ACN report "Anti-corruption Reforms in Eastern Europe and Central Asia. Progress and Challenges, 2009-2013". Also, the role of the Istanbul Anti-Corruption Action Plan in implementing anti-corruption reforms in participating countries and the impact it has helped to achieve will be discussed.

Further, other Istanbul Anti-Corruption Action Plan countries and other delegates are invited to express their views on the following questions: what are the main outcomes of the Istanbul Action Plan in its member countries; what impact it has helped to make; and what are the key remaining challenges that should be the focus of its future activities.

# Istanbul Anti-Corruption Action Plan Third Round of Monitoring Reports on Georgia and Azerbaijan

The first reading includes: presentation of the draft report by the monitoring experts, including changes that were introduced during the first bi-lateral consultation and any outstanding issues; presentation by the delegation of the monitored country of their views on the draft report, including any areas of disagreement; presentation of views of the civil society and international partners; plenary discussion of the draft report including outstanding issues, ratings and the new recommendations (representatives of countries involved in the second round of monitoring are invited to start the discussion, followed by all other present countries); and identification of outstanding issues for discussion in the second bilateral consultation.

The second reading includes: presentation of the changes introduced to the report during the second bi-lateral consultations by the monitoring experts; and plenary discussion of the proposed changes with the view to adopt the final report.

### Istanbul Anti-Corruption Action Plan: Progress Updates

Armenia, Kyrgyz Republic, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Ukraine and Uzbekistan should provide progress updates at this meeting, including a brief summary of measures taken to implement the recommendations provided in the previous monitoring report and any other major anti-corruption developments. During the meeting each country is asked to give a 10 minute presentation of its progress update. Further, experts/countries which participated in the previous monitoring round are invited to ask questions. Finally, civil society groups and other delegates are invited to contribute to the discussion. Written versions of the progress updates should be sent by 9 September 2013.

This item is to inform the ACN Steering Group on the progress made and next steps in the implementation of the ACN Work Programme 2013 - 2015 and on the role of the Steering Group in its evaluation. The format is a Secretariat presentation followed by questions and answers by the delegates.

# Consultations on ACN Thematic Studies on Criminalisation and Law Enforcement and on Anti-Corruption Policies and Prevention

Participants will be invited to split in two groups. The Secretariat will in further detail present the two draft terms of references. The Steering group members will be invited to provide their inputs on the scope, the sources of information, questionnaires, timeline, outputs and other methodological aspects of each study.

After that, in a roundtable, the delegates are invited to provide brief information on recent developments (reforms, examples of good practice, programmes, etc.) in their countries or organizations that can be used in the development of the thematic studies.
