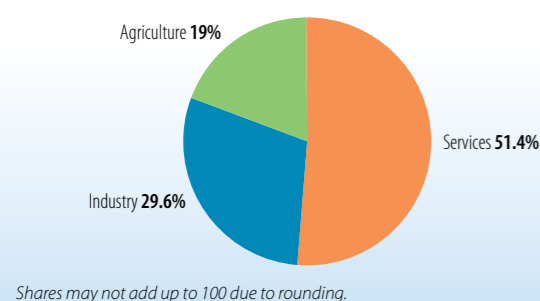


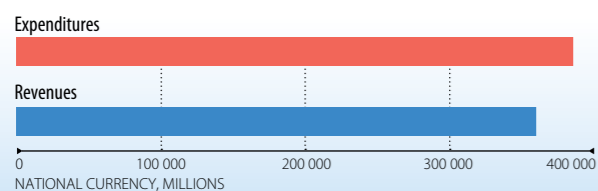

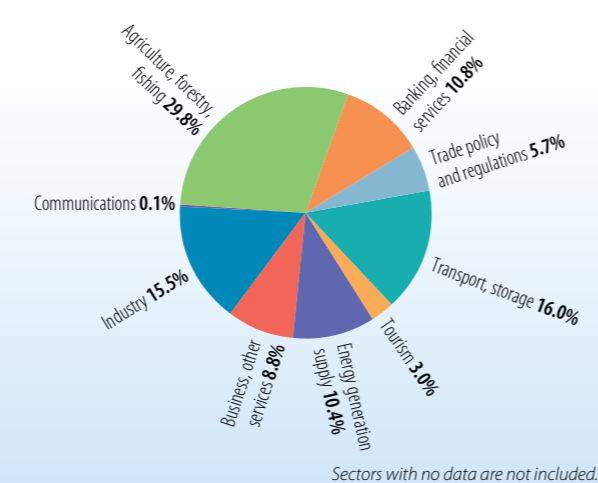

### BY SECTOR (Share in total AFT, commitments, 2009)



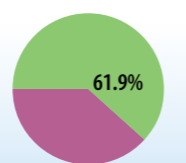
### SHARE IN ODA (Commitments, 2008-09 avg.)

AFT share in sector allocable ODA compared to its region and income group shares

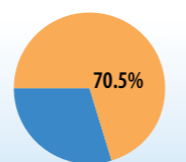

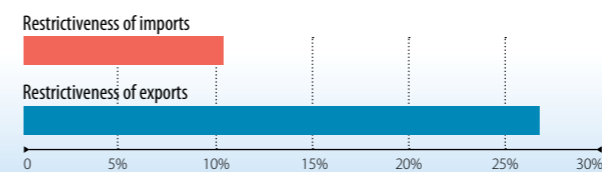

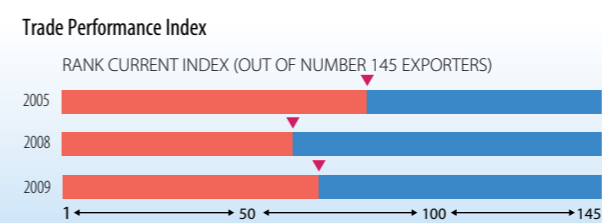
Changes to aid-for-trade priorities have been mainstreamed in the national development plan and operational strategies have been updated accordingly.

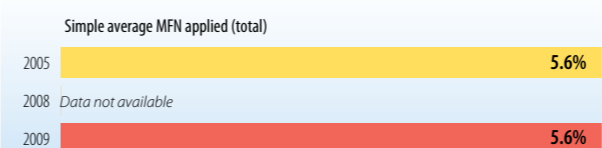

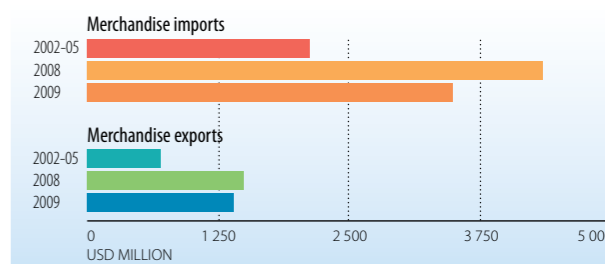

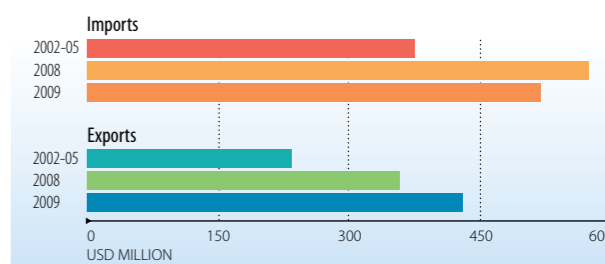

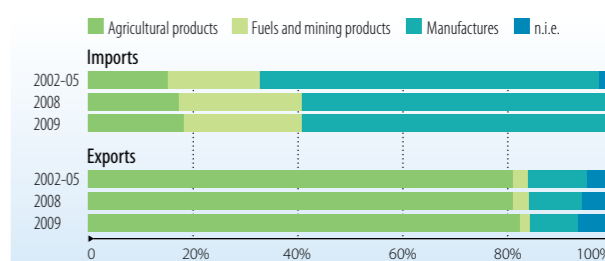
