At present, the IF housed at the Ministry of Commerce & Industry is first and foremost a country-driven process leading to the integration of trade into Liberia's Poverty Reduction Strategy (PRS). It fosters the coordinated delivery of Trade Related Technical Assistance to Liberia. Even though Liberia's development strategy (the PRS) does not fully capture trade, as the DTIS was done in tandem with the PRS, it has become an integral part of the Economic Pillar of the strategy (as it relates to trade). Trade related agencies of government especially the Ministry of Commerce & Industry as well as donors utilize it as the basis for identifying trade related needs of the country and channeling support.]
