It is important that the responsible agency does not directly involve the implementation of any project and has enough mandates for the task.

The mechanism / procedures to discuss with relevant donors the outcome and impact of trade-related program follows regulations for receiving ODA of the Government. At governmental level, Viet Nam organizes annual meetings and semi-annual meetings with Consultant Group of Donors. At these meeting, the government discussed with donors and their consultants on proposals, including aid for trade. Following the general direction on demand for ODA of the government, the Ministry of Industry and Trade regularly works with donors at official conferences, working meetings or by other types to discuss and implement projects on aid for trade. Based on proposals either make by Vietnamese agencies or donors, the two sides/ or group (in case of joint donor) regulate in the project document the specific requirements and evaluation methods for the outcome and impact of the project. An example in the document of the Beyond WTO Program, the Vietnamese side commits to exchange situation, information and results of the project regularly to donors.
