- DFID is the focus of accountability
- DFID is accountable
  - to Parliament,
  - to the centre of government
  - to interested stakeholders
  - to other donors
  - to partner countries





#### What is DFID accountable for?

- Poverty reduction and MDGs
  - Legislation
    - 2002 International Development Act
    - 2006 International Development (Transparency and Reporting) Act
    - Commitment to legislate for 0.7%
    - Cross-party commitment
  - Stakeholder interest

# **Innovations in formal accountability**

- Legislation
- International Development Committee
- Centre of government (Public Service Agreement, Treasury spending settlement, Capability Reviews)
- Accountability for international commitments (G8, Paris etc)
  Evaluation and Independent Advisory
  Committee on Development Impact



# **Innovations in informal accountability**

- Civil society monitoring of international commitments
- Stronger public communications, research on public attitudes, introduction of new "UKAid" brand



Transparency, IATI etc



# **Implications of greater accountability**

- Thematic spending targets, and White Paper "we will" commitments.
- Drive for attributable results

Challenge is to operate these in ways compatible with country-led development, and Paris Declaration
