








The new Jobs Strategy scoreboard

Average labour market performance among countries with low, intermediate and high employment rates



For each indicator, the concentric circles measure increasingly high levels of performance, reflecting higher or lower values depending on the direction of the arrow, with the inner (outer) circles indicating performance in the bottom (top) 20%
