Background

Since 2016, the GREEN Action Task Force, (and previously under the name of the EAP Task Force) has been a unique platform for interested OECD countries and development co-operation partners to work with the countries of Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA)¹ to facilitates reforms, development and implementation of policies that improve environmental quality and social well-being in the region, while creating opportunities for strong economic growth and decent jobs.

In 2022, the Environment Ministers who gathered at the 9th "Environment for Europe" Ministerial Conference agreed to renew the mandate of the Task Force² and called for the continuation of its activities, including support to Ukraine. Since the mandate renewal, the Task Force Secretariat has consulted with various members of the Task Force and stakeholders within the OECD Environmental Policy Committee on its future directions³.

Item 3: Selected focus topic: Strengthening compliance with environmental regulations, with a focus on mining/critical minerals

Moderator: Ms Martine Rohn-Brossard, Switzerland

Environmental compliance assurance refers to promotion, monitoring and enforcement of compliance with environmental regulations. Building on the OECD's two decades of experience working on this subject with Member and non-Member economies and in close co-operation with environmental inspectorates, the EU-funded EU4Environment Action: Green Economy Programme (2019-2024) has aimed to support the Eastern Partnership countries (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine) with strengthening their environmental liability regimes and compliance assurance systems.

This session will present the results of EU4Environment Action: Green Economy Programme, explore recent progress in environmental compliance assurance in the region and possible future areas of support. It will also facilitate an exchange on the challenges and approaches to regulating and enforcing compliance in the mining sector, which is an important economic sector in several countries in Eastern Europe and Central Asia.

Item 5: Selected focus topic: Mobilising finance for biodiversity protection in EECCA

In December 2022, EECCA countries, along with other Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity, adopted the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework. Discussions at the recent Annual Meeting of the Task Force, held in Istanbul in June 2023, and the subsequent informal brainstorming session and Bureau meeting of the Task Force, provided additional input from Task Force members and biodiversity experts. Among the proposals made by members and experts was the suggestion that the OECD Secretariat assess key drivers for biodiversity loss across the EECCA region. This assessment aims to help countries better understand such drivers and identify investment priorities to support their actions in addressing these drivers.

This session aims to present the initial findings of the assessment and facilitate discussions among participants on these findings. It also aims to exchange good practice examples and lessons learned regarding biodiversity financing mechanisms in the EECCA region, also possibly from outside the region. Further, the session will generate inputs for developing the Task Force's work for the period 2025-2026, to effectively support the EECCA countries and their development partners in mobilising finance for biodiversity in the region.
