The 2023 OECD Global Anti-Corruption & Integrity Forum (GACIF) focuses on policy solutions and business innovations that strengthen integrity and fight corruption. The 2023 GACIF will be preceded by several integrity-related events, including the event "Promoting integrity and fighting corruption in the MENA region", bringing together representatives of the **MENA-OECD Working Group on Civil Service and Integrity** and of the **MENA-OECD Business Integrity Network**.



The MENA-OECD Working Group on Civil Service and Integrity is part of the MENA-OECD Governance Programme and brings together policy practitioners from the Middle East & North Africa (MENA) region and OECD countries to engage in promoting public integrity and preventing corruption. The Working Group is a unique space for promoting regional dialogue and exchanging good practices in the area of civil service reforms for integrity and innovative anti-corruption policies and institutions.

The <u>MENA-OECD Business Integrity Network</u> is part of the MENA-OECD Competitiveness Programme and promotes business integrity in the MENA region by bringing together regional businesses and public anti-corruption officials to build awareness about the need to fight corruption and develop a culture of integrity in the private sector. The MENA-OECD Business Integrity Network organises meetings and seminars where both private- and public-sector representatives can meet with OECD experts and exchange experiences on how to combat bribery and corruption, and foster integrity.

This meeting is the joint effort of the Public Governance Directorate, the OECD Middle East and Africa Division, Global Relations and Cooperation Directorate, and the Anti-Corruption Division, Directorate for Financial and Enterprise Affairs.
