

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### **Definitions**

- Family: part of a household comprising either persons in a couple and their children or stepchildren living in the same principal residence, or a parent living without a spouse with his/her children
  - in the study : at least one child is a minor
- Immigrant: person residing in France and born abroad with a foreign nationality at birth
- Descendant of immigrants: person born in France, residing in France and having at least one immigrant parent



Part of a household comprising a single parent with his/her children

Family consisting of a couple of adults and at least one child who is not the child of one of the two members of the couple Family consisting of a couple of adults and children born of their union

### What we want to know:

- How can we explain the differences in family structure between the main origins of immigrants and descendants and people unrelated to migration?
  - French survey data (EFL)
- Are the family structures of immigrants and descendants more similar to those of their country of origin or of their host country?
  - International data (IPUMS)


## The Family and Housing Survey (EFL)

- Fertility, life as a couple, family structures and children's care
- Conducted in 2011 and linked to the French census of the same year
- > 360,000 adults living in ordinary households in metropolitan France
  - 12,000 immigrants living in a family with at least one minor child
  - 9,000 descendants living in a family with at least one minor child







### **IPUMS-International**


- IPUMS: Integrated Public Use Microdata Series
- Provides census samples from 55 countries
- Harmonizes data to allow comparisons by country and over time
- No data on the family type, but on the household structure comparisons with EFL

### **IPUMS-International : limitations of comparisons**


- Data only available for a few African countries (Morocco, Burkina Faso, Cameroon and Ghana). No data on these countries in EFL → use of French census 2011 (immigrants only)
- Older data (from 2000 to 2011)



### Conclusion

Two groups can be distinguished regarding their family structure:
Southern Europe and to a lesser extent Maghreb, whose profiles are close to the ones of the population unrelated to migration

- Africa (except Maghreb) and Turkey, which have their **own profile** 

- Most of the discrepancies in family types come from unexplained factors, including the origin itself. The unexplained factors are less significant for the descendants
- Despite the effects of origin, the family structure of immigrants, and even more for the descendants, is generally more similar to the one of the persons of the host country than of the country of origin
- > Hypotheses:

- immigrants have adapted themselves to the host country

- they are initially selected within their country of origin because of their socio-demographic characteristics and family conceptions close to the host country
