### ■ About the event

Regions in industrial transition face significant challenges that can profoundly affect their labour markets, productivity, and overall quality of life for residents, including shifting globalisation trends, increased digitalisation, demographic change, and the crucial transition to a zero-emissions economy. In these regions, traditional policy solutions have not always yielded the desired results, indicating that the mechanisms being used to manage industrial transition – from governance arrangements to programming design and implementation – may need to be revisited and recalibrated, or alternatively complemented or replaced with new approaches.

Identifying these new approaches has been the focus of the "Pilot Action on Regions in Industrial Transition", an innovative joint project of the European Commission and the OECD. Since its launch in 2018, this initiative has explored new ways to foster innovation, encourage risk-taking within existing innovation and regional development frameworks, and support high-impact actions in regions in transition.

This virtual event will launch the OECD report Regions in Industrial Transition 2023: New Approaches to Persistent Problems. This report, generated from the concluding phase of the collaboration with the European Commission, assesses the effectiveness of experimental approaches to governance and programming arrangements, and their potential to stimulate innovation and facilitate industrial transition. Enriched by case studies of the eight regions and two countries participating in the 2021-2023 phase of the Pilot Action, the report confirms the relevance of governance dimensions to the success of industrial transition initiatives, including framework conditions, strategic programming, and active stakeholder engagement. It also highlights the value of experimentation in policy and programming.

This event will provide an opportunity for national and regional policy makers, innovators and all those interested in the future of industrial transition to explore the OECD's findings and engage in constructive dialogue about our industrial and economic future.
