She has also substantial interdisciplinary experience working with natural and social scientists. In 2015 she was appointed to the Farm Animal Welfare Committee, the esteemed expert committee that advises Defra and the devolved administrations in Scotland and Wales on the welfare of farmed animals. In 2014 she was awarded a prestigious fellowship by the *Japan Society for the Promotion of Science*. She sits on the Executive Board of the Agricultural Economics Society and a regional steering group, the North East Farming and Rural Advisory Network. She has published widely and is an associate editor of the *Journal of Agricultural Economics* and sits on the advisory board of *EuroChoices*.
