



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The OECD Review: Lessons learned (some of them...)

Challenges

- 1- To build a **stronger relationship** among the different components of the education sector: **upper secondary school**, **vocational tertiary education and universities**.
- 2- To implement a **comprehensive "tableau du bord" with robust data** to support **evidence-based decision-making** towards targeted efforts to address human capital development needs.
- **3-** To **strength sectoral orientation in workforce development** and design specific programs to ensure the future enrolment to tertiary education of young people whose parents / families arrived to Catalonia during the last huge immigration wave (2000-2009, around 1 million people).
- **4-** To **reinforce** the presence of **entrepreneurship dimension in regular degrees**, specially at the Master level.
- **5-** To **map university expertise** and promote PhD mobility to firms to better interface with the productive sectors and companies' needs.



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The OECD Review: Lessons learned (some of them...)

Opportunities

- 1- The implementation of degrees adapted to Bologna, provides an opportunity to create stronger links between universities and the regional employers through students internships and work-based learning.
- **2-** To promote a **higher education council at the Catalan level**, embracing vocational tertiary education institutio*ns*, public and private universities and key stakeholders, including representation of the regional administration and the main social and economic agents.
- **3-** To implement "challenge-driven" research grants for universities, research groups and centres, relevant for the Catalan region development and sustainability and for its citizen welfare.
- 4- To organize and stimulate firm demand for knowledge to build up a better interface with universities and research centres, developing a regional knowledge transfer model.

The Barcelona Agenda on Higher Education

- 1- To strength the links between the City Council, the Barcelona Metropolitan Area universities and the main social & economic agents, reinforcing the role of the "International Excellence Campuses", awarded by the Spanish Ministry of Education to UB, UPC, UAB & UPF, as strategic tool in the path towards the "Barcelona Knowledge City".
- 2- Take advantage of the existence of the "Fundació Barcelona, Formació Professional" (devoted to Vocational Training promotion) to develop specific pilot programs to strengths the links among the different levels of tertiary education and to address the specific education needs of people arrived during the last 10 years to Barcelona, from less developed areas of the world.
- 3- To reinforce the competitiveness of the main "clusters" developed at the 22@, the Innovation District, IT, Media, Biotech, Design and Energy, by approaching them to the university R+D capabilities and promoting the mobility between firms and the academia.
- 4- To support an **interuniversity platform, the "Barcelona HE Cluster"**, to promote the internationalization of the Masters degrees offered by the HE institutions (public and private) as a tool for talent attraction from elsewhere in the world.
