What is a PRES?

A PRES (Pôle de recherché et d'enseignement supérieur) is a group of French institutions of higher education and research aimed to create more visible entities, especially in terms of international rankings. Since 2006, about 20 PRES have been founded. These poles are still in the development stage and projects more or less advanced.

More about the PRES Hésam

The PRES héSam (*Pôle de recherche et d'enseignement supérieur: "Research and Higher Education Cluster"*) is an alliance of 15 higher education institutions. Formally established on December 31, 2010, it represents more than 55,000 students, 130,000 lifelong training auditors, 2,400 engineering degrees awarded per year (the second largest in France), 4,300 faculty members, teachers and researchers, 6,500 PhD students and 139 research units. PRES héSam is one of the most important PRES – and the most important one in the social sciences and the humanities.

PRES héSam is uniquely placed at the crossroads of knowledge and action, research and application. Its mission is to promote the management of complexity in the service of innovation, an approach which also seeks to leverage the essential complementarities between the culture of universities and schools, selective courses and lifelong learning, administrative and management cultures, the creativity of workshops and spirit of discovery embodied by research units.

In short, héSam views itself as a major laboratory where a new links can be forged between knowledge and innovation in the service of social development.
