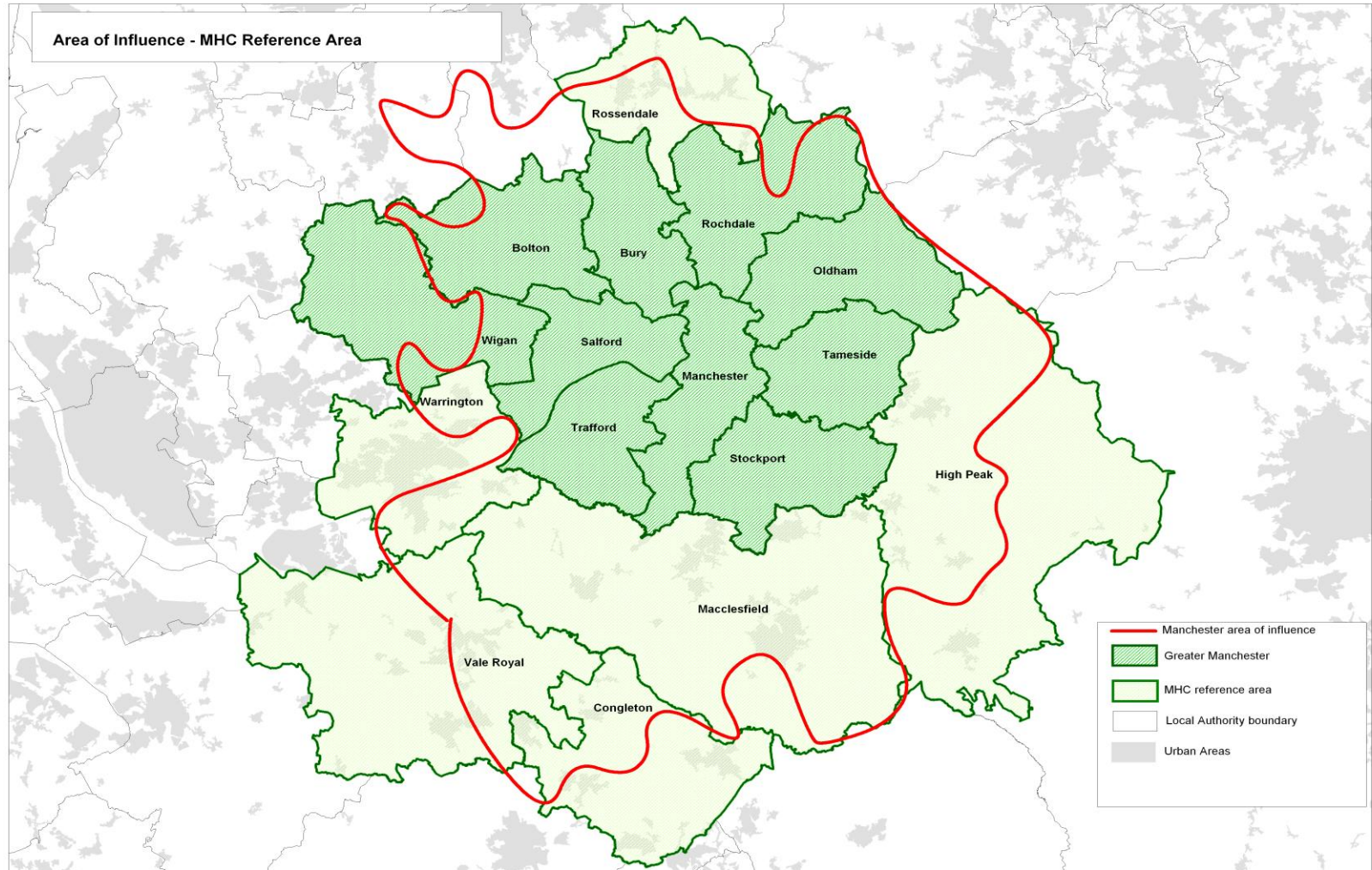

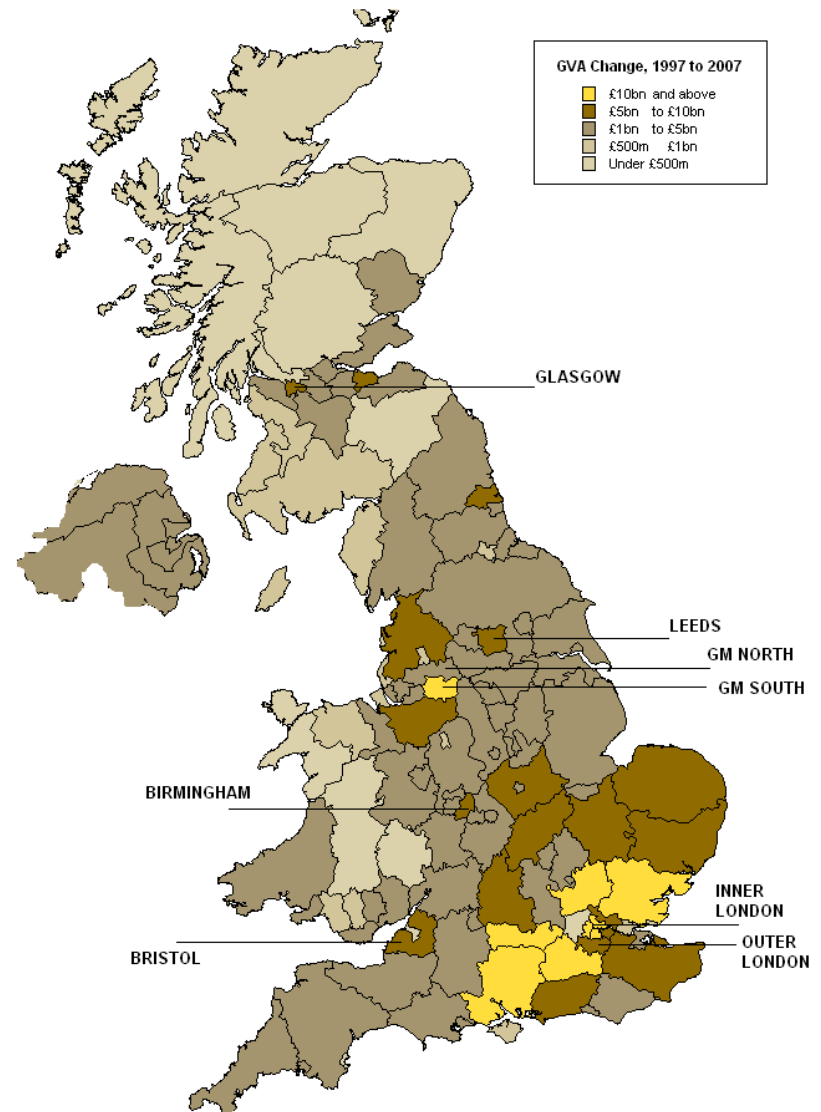
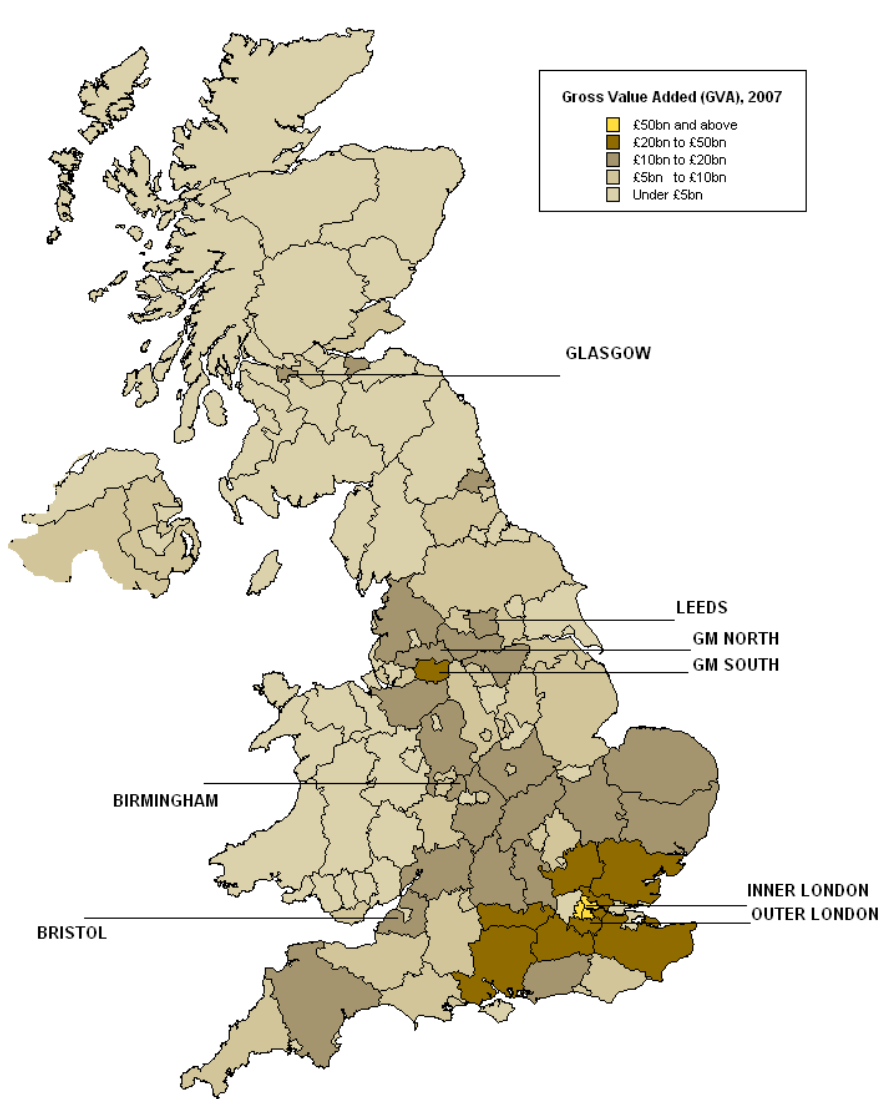

Metropolitan area and city region of Manchester

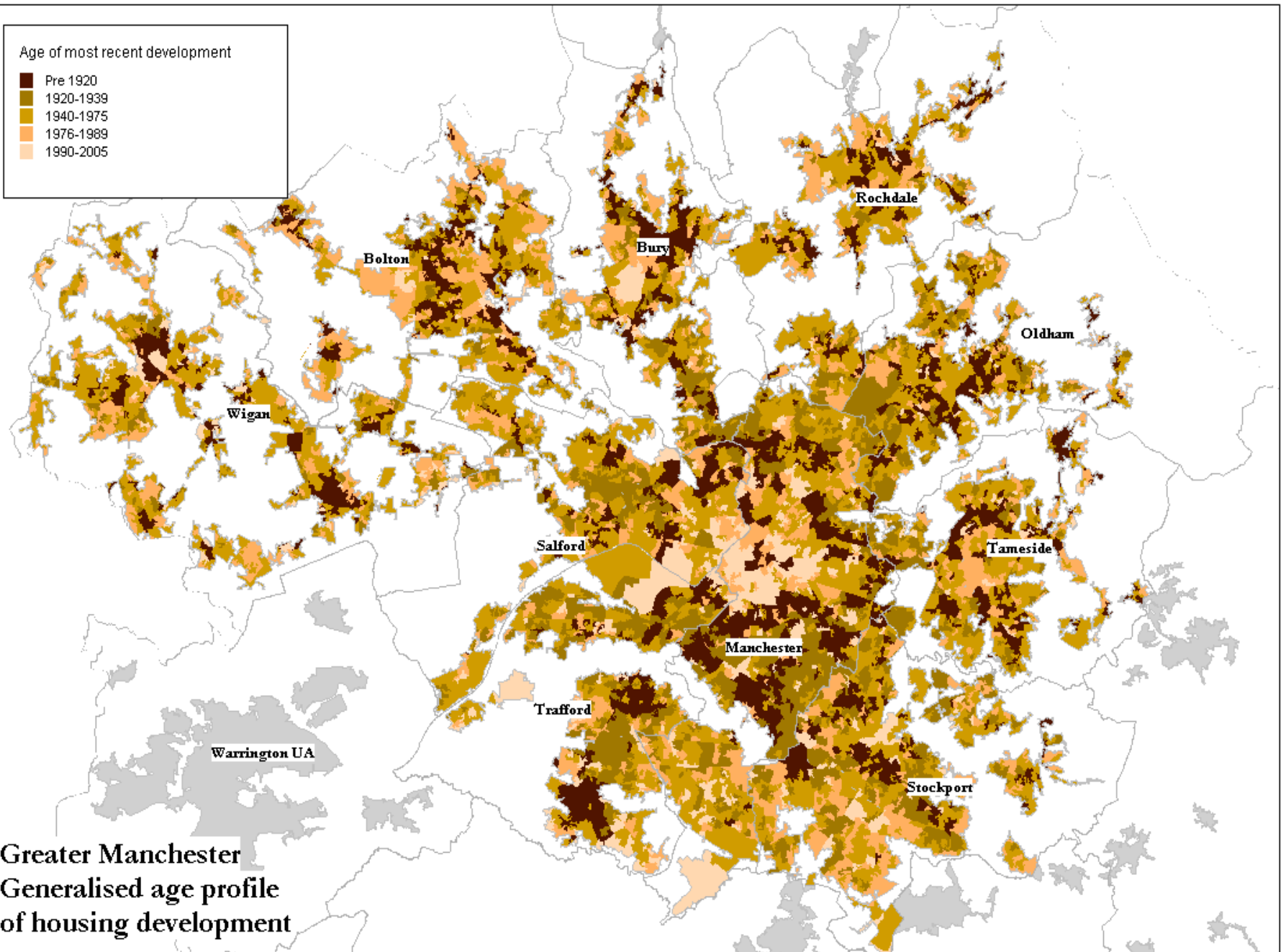

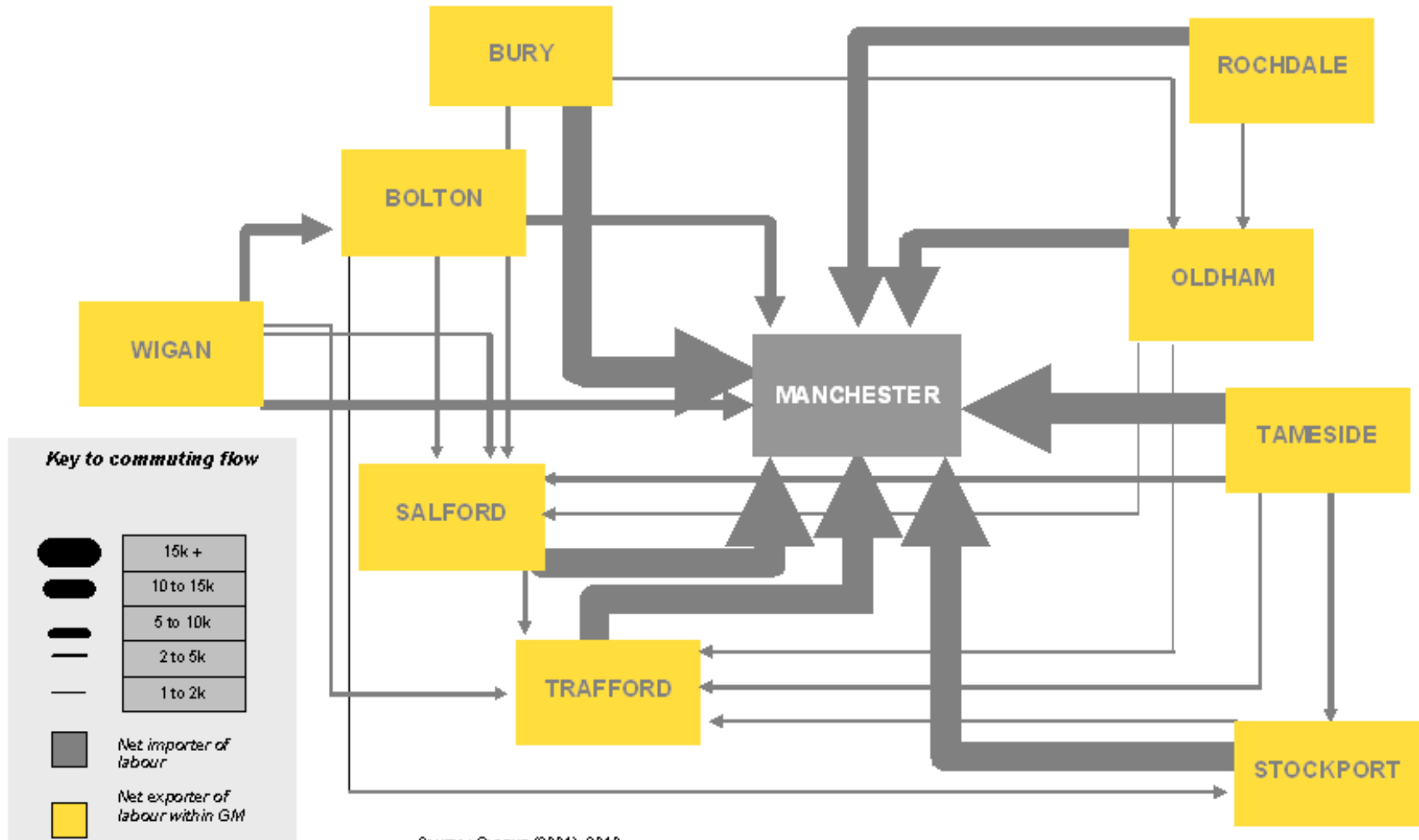
Age of most recent development
