THE ORGANISATION FOR ECONOMIC CO-OPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The OECD is a unique forum where governments work together to address the economic, social and environmental challenges of globalisation. The Organisation provides a setting where governments can compare policy experience, seek answers to common problems, identify good practice and work to co-ordinate domestic and international policies.

Since 2000, the OECD South East Europe Regional Programme has been closely collaborating with economies of the region to foster growth, investment and employment through reforms that support competitiveness and private sector development. The programme addresses regional and national needs, capacities and reform priorities while translating OECD standards and best practices into actionable advice for South East European (SEE) economies.

WHAT IS THE COMPETITIVENESS OUTLOOK?

Drawing on key OECD tools and standards, the <u>Competitiveness Outlook</u> publication series is the most comprehensive assessment of economic performance, governance and regulation in the six Western Balkan (WB6) economies. It covers 15 key policy areas that are interrelated and make up five thematic cluster: (1) Business environment; (2) Skills system; (3) Greening; (4) Digitalisation and technology; (5) Connectivity and infrastructure

The Competitiveness Outlook seeks to provide the region's policy makers with a multidimensional benchmarking tool, enabling them to compare performance against regional peers as well as OECD good practices, and to design future policies based on rich evidence and actionable policy recommendations The last edition was launched at the <u>Leaders Meeting of the Berlin Process Western Balkans Summit</u> in July 2021 where several Heads of State and Government lauded that the OECD Competitiveness Outlook's policy recommendations serve not only "as guidance and inspiration for pursuing an ambitious, inclusive and sustainable reform agenda in the Western Balkans" but also "provide a necessary and useful evidence base for the post-COVID-19 recovery of the region."

THE MEETING

While the meeting will provide an overview of the assessment status for all five thematic clusters of the Competitiveness Outlook, it will in particular zoom in on the greening cluster, comprised of relevant indicators of the (1) environment; (2) energy; (3) transport; and (4) agriculture policy dimensions.

The meeting aims to achieve two main objectives:

- 1) Closing information gaps: The discussions will focus on obtaining any remaining information necessary to enhance the understanding of the provided inputs, particularly for the green cluster. This will help fill any information gaps and provide a more comprehensive assessment.
- 2) Identifying achievements, challenges, and policy priorities: The meeting will facilitate discussions among participants to identify and discuss key achievements and challenges, particularly within the greening cluster. Additionally, potential policy options will be explored, allowing for an exchange of ideas and perspectives on how to address the identified challenges and further enhance competitiveness.

WHO WILL BE THERE?

The meeting will bring together the National Competitiveness Outlook Co-ordinator, policy makers who contributed to the government self-assessment (in particular Dimension Contact Points) and representatives of the Statistical Office. Meeting participants will also include representatives of the European Commission and non-government stakeholders such as NGOs, private-sector, academia representatives.

COMPETITIVENESS OUTLOOK 2024: BACKGROUND, OBJECTIVE AND PROCESS

The fourth edition of the Competitiveness Outlook will provide Western Balkan policy makers with a multi-dimensional benchmarking tool to compare their performance across 15 policy dimensions and enable them to design future policies based on rich evidence and actionable policy recommendations. The publication draws on inputs and feedback from both government and non-government stakeholders, which contributes to the versatility and relevance of the assessment.

During this intervention, the OECD will provide a short recap of the Competitiveness Outlook methodology and familiarize stakeholders with the 2024 assessment process. The OECD will also highlight the data gaps across the 15 policy areas of the 2024 *Competitiveness Outlook*, with a focus on four policy areas that make up the greening cluster: (1) Environment policy; (2) energy policy; (3) transport policy; and (4) agriculture policy.
