THE ORGANISATION FOR ECONOMIC CO-OPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The OECD is a unique forum where governments work together to address the economic, social and environmental challenges of globalisation. The Organisation provides a setting where governments can compare policy experience, seek answers to common problems, identify good practice and work to coordinate domestic and international policies.

The OECD South East Europe (SEE) regional programme supports economies in the region in the design and implementation of reforms in favour of stronger growth, higher investment and full employment. The programme started in 2000 as the OECD Investment Compact for South East Europe to later extend the scope of its activities and become the OECD South East Europe regional programme. Since inception, the programme has involved partners from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Kosovo*, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Romania and Serbia. The Programme's work is structured around three main areas of expertise:

(1) Business environment and competitiveness; (2) SMEs and private sector development; and (3) Business integrity and fair market conditions



WHAT IS THE COMPETITIVENESS OUTLOOK? The Competitiveness Outlook is a key benchmarking tool for the six Western Balkan governments (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo*, Montenegro, North Macedonia and

Serbia) that supports their domestic policy cycles throughout their design, implementation and monitoring stages. While a number of other indices and benchmarking reports assess the business environment in those Western Balkan economies, the Competitiveness Outlook's participatory assessment process takes into account the views of different stakeholders (government representatives, academic community, NGOs, the private sector) to create a balanced assessment on future reform. The Competitiveness Outlook focuses on 16 policy areas and evaluates crucial issues affecting economic competitiveness to identify a sustainable economic reform agenda and provide policy makers with actionable policy recommendations.



THE MEETING

The objective of this meeting will be to present and discuss the key assessment findings for North Macedonia. To this end the meeting will bring together policymakers from North Macedonia who contributed to the assessment, OECD and international experts, as well as representatives from the European Commission.
