The benefits of reducing trade costs in an interdependent world

#### Q2: CASE STORY ABSTRACT

The theme of the fifth Global Review of Aid for Trade is "Reducing Trade Costs for Inclusive, Sustainable Growth". This submission discusses a number of recent studies undertaken at the Overseas Development Institute on the global impacts of Aid for Trade through reducing trade costs. It argues that (1) Aid for Trade can lower trade costs with the potential to support economic transformation in recipient countries (section 1); and (2) providers of Aid for Trade also benefit from cheaper trade costs (section 2). Section 3 concludes arguing that Aid for Trade is an increasingly appropriate form of development co-operation in an interdependent world.

#### **Q3: THE CASE STORY**

This submission has argued that (1) Aid for Trade can lower trade costs which can benefit recipient countries with the potential to support economic transformation; and (2) providers of Aid for Trade also benefit from cheaper trade costs. The econometric studies and modelling studies suggest that Aid for Trade can be a powerful source of benefits for trade through trade costs, which in turn can raise the volume and diversification of exports and economic transformation in developing countries. This has important knock on effects for those countries that provide such aid in the first place. Such spillovers have been growing as countries become increasingly interdependent.
