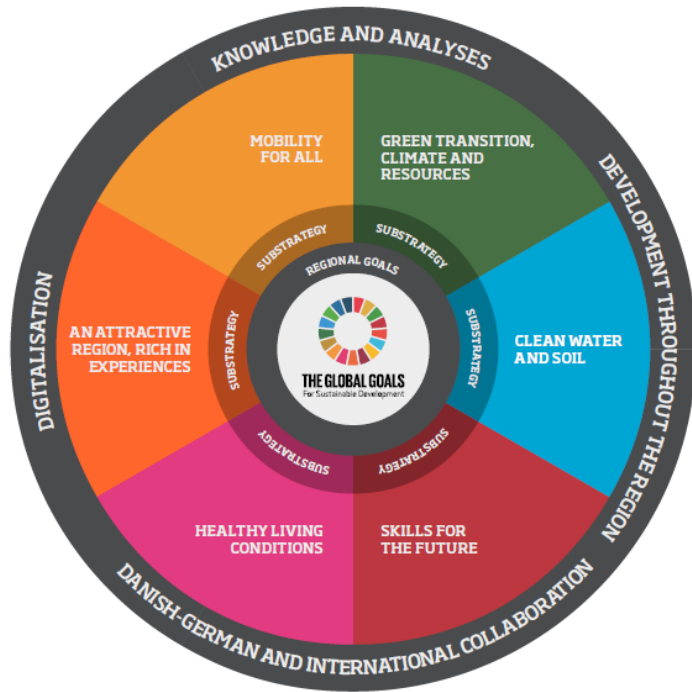

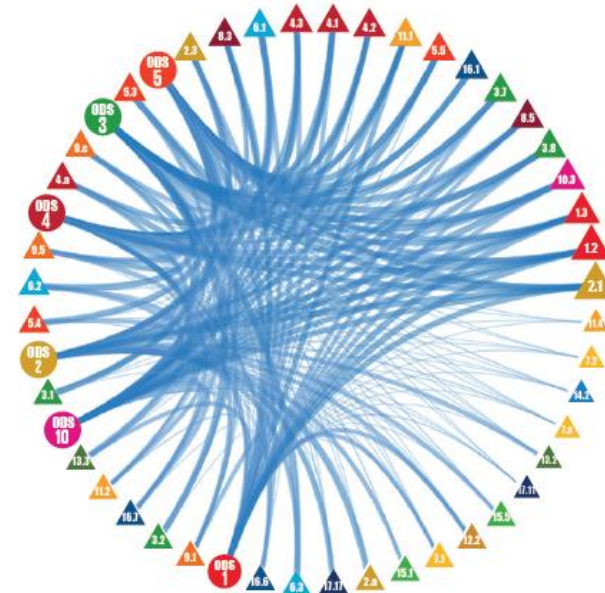

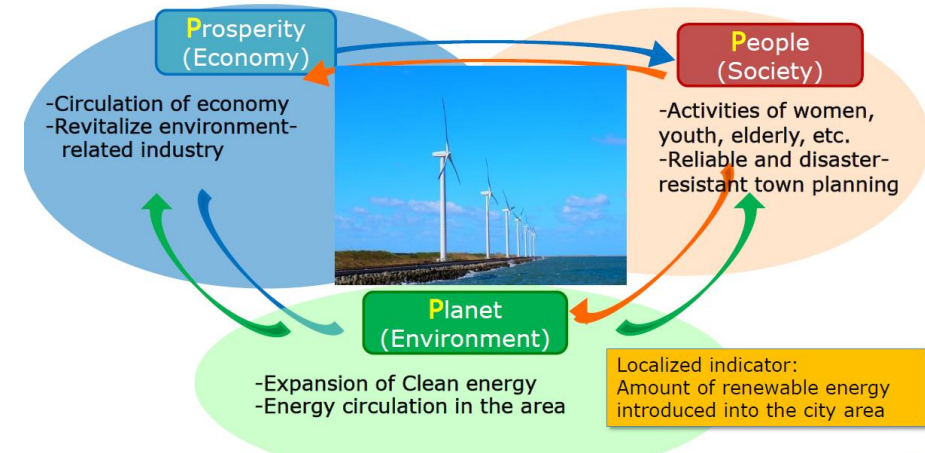


► Grafico 1: Matriz de relaciones entre los 6 ODS y las 42 metas
