
EDRC Mandate

The Council decided, mindful of the vision 'to achieve the highest sustainable economic growth and employment and a rising standard of living in Member countries' and 'to contribute to sound economic expansion in Member as well as non-member countries', that the Economic and Development Review Committee (EDRC) will examine on a regular basis and make comments and <u>country-specific</u> <u>recommendations on the macroeconomic and structural</u> <u>policies</u> of the Member countries and selected non-Member economies and on the interaction of these policies in raising economic performance.





Number of EDRC Reviews







Frequency of Surveys

- For Member Countries and for the Euro Area/European Union: Survey Intervals of 21-22 Months
- Economic Reviews of Non-Members: every 24-30 Months
- Number of Surveys will rise from 22 in 2008 to approx. 23-24 in 2009



Format of Surveys (130 – 150 Pages)

- Executive Summary
- Assessments and Recommendations
- Introduction Chapter: Macroeconomic short– and longer-term Perspectives/Key Challenges
- Longer-term Fiscal Issues
- (Two) Chapters on Structural Policy Issues
 - 'In-depth' Chapter
 - Other structural Chapter to improve Economic Performance





EDRC Topics

- Main Focus: Economic Efficiency and Effectiveness of Economic Policy
 - Fiscal Policy
 - sustainability of public finances
 - structure of tax systems
 - Monetary Policy
 - Policies to increase Economic Potential
 - Regulatory Efficiency
 - Labour Markets
 - Product Markets
 - Financial Markets



EDRC Topics – SD related (1)

- Social Sustainability
 - Education
 - Early Childhood education (languages)
 - Human capital formation
 - Social Security Systems
 - Pension systems
 - Health systems
 - Labour Market
 - Integration of groups at the margin (immigrants, older workers, women etc.)
 - Poverty reduction (in work benefits)
 - Housing Policy



EDRC Topics – SD related (2)

- Environment
 - Special chapters
 - Water management (AUS)
 - Long Term Sustainability of the Energy Sector (CAN)
 - Other environment related topics
 - Climate change (CO2 Emission Trading Scheme, pricing, Kyoto targets)
 - Environmental performance in Agriculture (Water, Soil, Biofuels)
 - Pollution
 - Energy taxation



Some ideas to improve...

- How to bring SD issues to the forefront...
 - Implement AMSDE proposals
 - Assess country performance in a more integrated fashion
 - Develop SD measurement and assessment methodologies
 - Use the multi-disciplinary approach of the OECD
 - Enrich Committees' Mandates with explicit SD references
 - EDRC specific
 - Choice of "In depth chapter"
 - Provide Country Desks with SD tools (standards, existing country specific analysis, assessment tools)
