

ALFREDO GUTIERREZ ORTIZ MENA

Professional biography

Alfredo Gutierrez Ortiz Mena obtained his law degree from the National Autonomous University of Mexico. At Harvard University he received a masters degree and a certificate in international taxation.

In 1995 he joined the Ministry of Finance and Public Credit, with the Revenue and International Tax Matters Directorate. Latter, he joined the Office of the Attorney General for Tax Matters.

In 1998 Alfredo Gutierrez began private practice as an associate with different Mexican and international law firms such as Covington & Burling of Washington, D.C., Ortiz, Sainz y Tron, S. C., Holland & Knight – Gallástegui y Lozano, S. C. and White & Case, S.C., all of the latter in Mexico City. His private practice focused mainly in international taxation law and business.

Mr. Gutierrez is a member of the Mexican Bar Association (Barra Mexicana Colegio de Abogados, A.C.) and the New York Bar.

From October 2003 to December 2006 he acted as Chief Counsel of the Mexican Revenue Service. Later, he was appointed as General Administrator for Large Taxpayers. In July 2008, pursuant to the initiative of President Felipe Calderon Hinojosa, the Mexican Congress ratified his appointment as Commissioner of the Mexican Revenue Service.
