Professor, Meiji University, Tokyo, Japan

Keizo Yamawaki specializes in migrant integration policy and a leading expert in Japan. He has advised numerous local governments as well as ministries of the national government.

He graduated from the Faculty of Law at the University of Tokyo and also from the School of International and Public Affairs at Columbia University. After working for the United Nations Development Programme, he became a research fellow at Meiji Gakuin University and has been teaching at Meiji University since 1996.

Since 2010, he has promoted exchange of ideas and good practices in migrant inclusion between cities in Japan and those in Europe and Australia. In 2012-2013, he was a visiting fellow of the University of Oxford and that of the Migration Policy Group, Brussels. In 2018, he was chosen as one of the awardees of the Foreign Minister's Commendations for his work on migrant integration in Japan. He teaches on Nakano Campus of Meiji University, and his students are actively engaged in intercultural community building in the city of Nakano, Tokyo.

He is best known in Japan as the chair of the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications' committee which produced the first governmental report on migrant integration in 2006.
