# Making ports and logistics networks an asset for regional development

Organised by the OECD Centre for Entrepreneurship, SMEs, Regions and Cities (CFE), with the support of the European Commission, and in collaboration with the International Transport Forum (ITF), the OECD Development Centre (DEV), and the International Association of Cities and Ports (AIVP), this is the second in the OECD webinar series on Rethinking Regional Attractiveness. It will inform the OECD's work on Rethinking territorial development policies in the new global environment, and the wider CFE activity on Regions in Globalisation.

**Globalisation influences regional development** through economic, human and knowledge channels. However, for interactions to materialise, infrastructure connections are key. Without relevant access to road, airport, train, broadband and logistics networks, regions may lose opportunities for export and be less attractive to FDI, talent and visitors. Among infrastructure hubs, **ports remain at the frontline of globalisation**, with around 80 per cent of global trade by volume and over 70 per cent of global trade by value carried by sea and handled by ports worldwide. At the same time, regional policy choices related to port and logistics networks can also shape different types of globalisation.

This 2<sup>nd</sup> webinar focuses on **infrastructure connections** as a relevant factor in the internationalisation and attractiveness of regions vis-a-vis investors, talent, visitors, and exporters. It will provide an opportunity for participants to hear from international experts and practitioners as they share experiences and good practices on **making ports and logistics networks an asset for regional development**. The interactive format encourages a sharing of views between participants from national, regional and local governments, port authorities and business.

The webinar explores the role of ports for regional development, and is structured around two key pillars:

- 1. The links between types of ports and regional development: what demand for what types of ports?
- 2. Connecting ports with hinterland regions for inclusive and sustainable development: multimodality and logistics
