- Official governmental cooperation between the Nordic countries, established in 1971
- The Prime Ministers have the overall responsibility for the cooperation
- Secretariat in Copenhagen, Denmark with approx. 100 employees
- Annual budget 125 million Euro






Arctic Co-operation Programme 2012-2014











- > 12 thematic integrated projects where industry, acedemia and governments work together
- Business affiliation in the programmes on wind, bioenergy and nanotechnology is from 25-50%.
