

Manie Geyer obtained the D.Phil degree in Urban Planning in 1986. In 1983 he joined Potchefstroom University where he was promoted to full Professor of Urban and Regional Planning in 1998. In 2009 he was appointed as the Statistics South Africa Chair at Stellenbosch University where he established CRUISE (the Centre for Regional and Urban Innovation and Statistical Exploration) at the Geography Department. His research interests lie in globalization, location theory, urban systems analysis, demography and migration, urban development policy and social polarization. Academically and as a consultant he has coordinated a number of governmental and academic research projects nationally and internationally. He serves on the editorial board of several journals and is the 2009 recipient of the International Prize of Urban Creation in regional science. His latest edited volumes include: *The International Handbook of Urban Systems* (2002); *Global Regionalization* (2006) and *The International Handbook of Urban Policy, Volumes 1 and 2* (2007; 2010).
