

Mr. Marcel is the Deputy Director of the Public Governance and Territorial Development Directorate (GOV), he provides leadership in managing the various issues covered, such as, Reform of the Public Sector, Anti Corruption, Regulatory Policy, Budgeting and Public Expenditure, Governance Reviews and Regional Development.

Since 2007, Mr. Marcel was working at the Inter-American Development Bank (IADB) where he was the Manager of the Institutional Capacity and Finance Sector. Before that, he was an associate researcher at the Corporación de Estudios para Latinoamérica (CIEPLAN) in Chile, and for six years Director of the Budget Office in the Ministry of Finance in Chile. Mr. Marcel has also worked as Executive Director for the Chile and Ecuador Board of Directors in IADB, as Executive Secretary of the Inter-Ministerial Committee for the Modernization of Public Management and as Chairperson of the Internal Audit Council in Chile.

At the IADB, Mr. Marcel led a department in charge of the design, negotiation and supervision of IDB loans to support public sector reform, institutional capacity development, public finances, decentralization, local development, capital markets, financial development and competitiveness. He has also led successful initiatives aimed at improving public governance in Chile, being recognized as a Regional Leader in Management for Development Results. Mr. Marcel has been actively involved in the work of the OECD over the past 15 years, in particular as a regular attendant of the Senior Budget Officials Network.

Of Chilean and Spanish nationality, Mr. Marcel holds an M. Phil. degree in Economics from the University of Cambridge, UK.
