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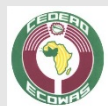

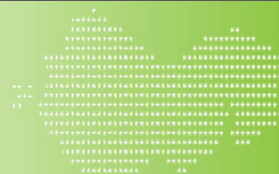

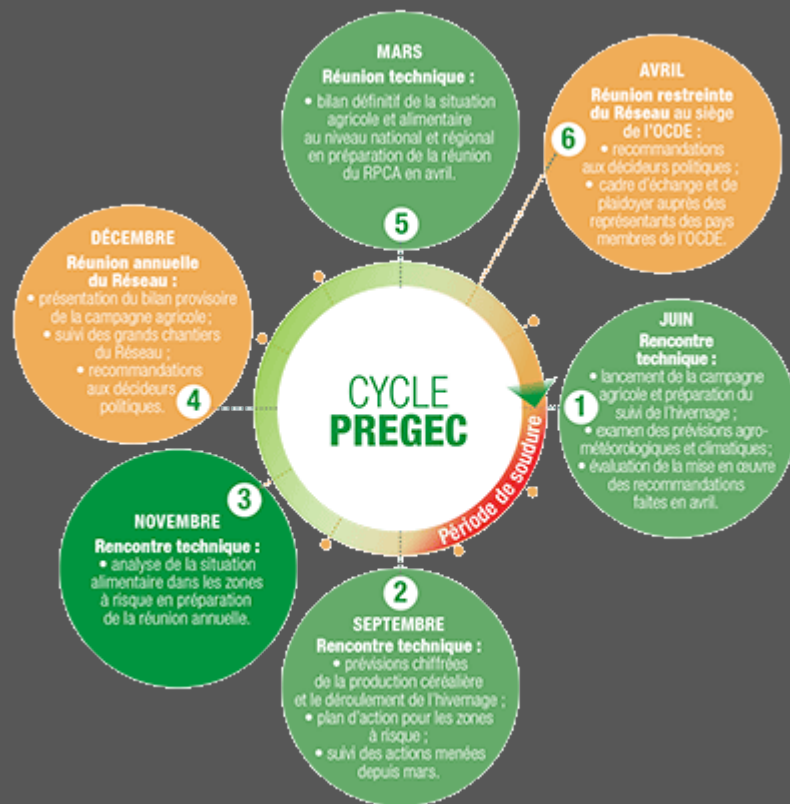

1 FOREWORD

On 10 February 1990, upon a proposal made by the Food Crisis Prevention Network (RPCA), the member countries of the "Permanent Interstate Committee for Drought Control in the Sahel" (CILSS) and the donor members of the "Club du Sahel" adopted the Food Aid Charter. This code of good conduct intended to minimise the adverse effects of food aid and to ultimately phase-out the need for it.

Building upon an inclusive and participatory revision process conducted between 2007 and 2011, the revised Charter, renamed the Charter for Food Crisis Prevention and Management, was formally adopted by Ministers of Food and Agriculture from ECOWAS Member States as well as Chad and Mauritania on 17 November 2011 at a ministerial meeting held in Conakry (Guinea). It was approved by the 40th Ordinary Session of the ECOWAS Heads of States and Government Summit held on 16-17 February 2012.

The parties concerned: governments¹, intergovernmental organisations (IGOs), civil society organisations (CSOs)², technical and financial partners (TFPs)³.

1 The term "governments" refers to the governments of the 17 countries (CILSS) member countries plus Mauritania and Chad.
 2 The term "CSOs" includes farmer organisations, trade unions and employer federations, NGOs, professional associations, churches, community organisations, organisations that provide services to local and national level, the private sector, etc.
 3 TFPs include bilateral and multilateral donors and international organisations (UN system and others).

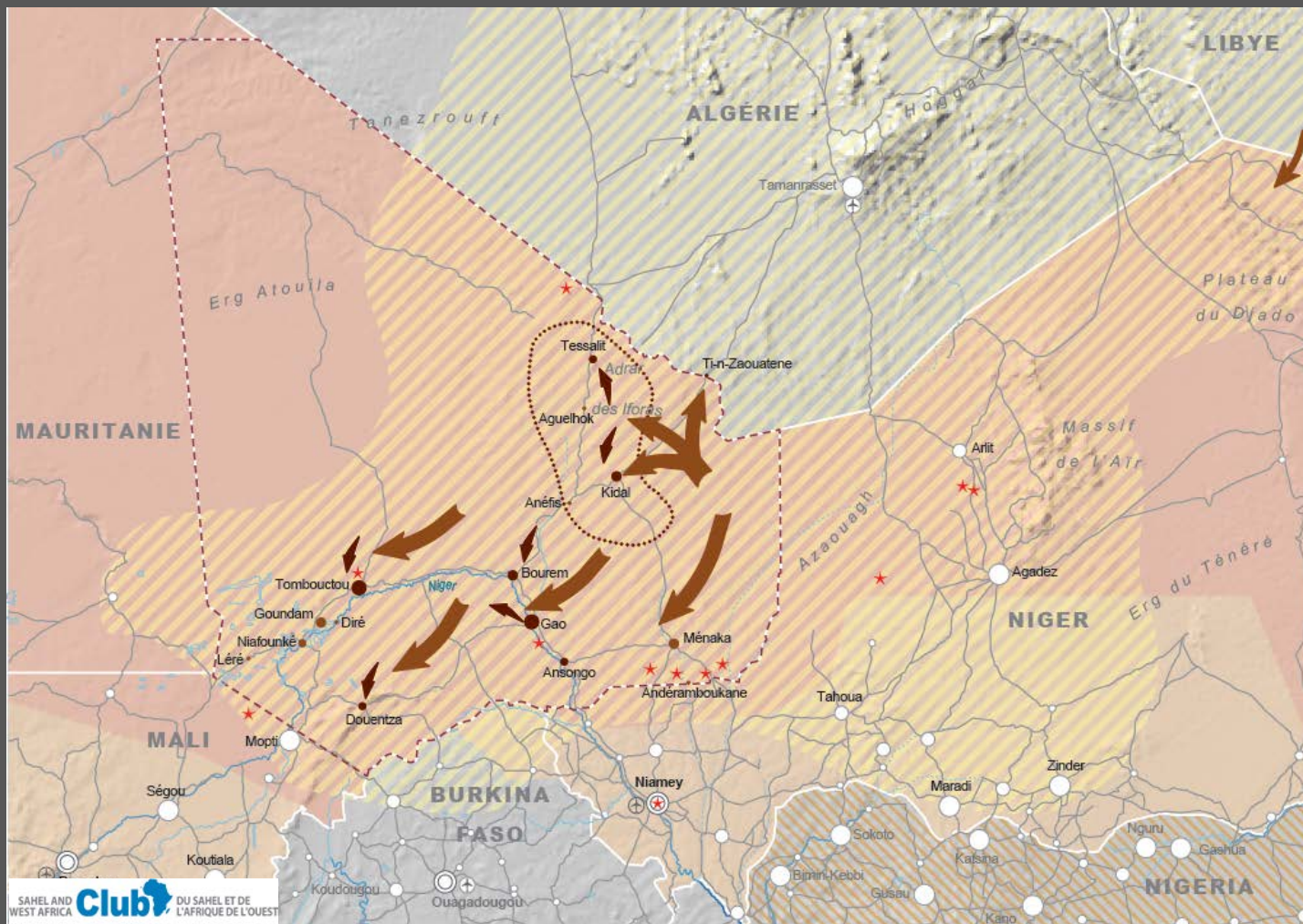

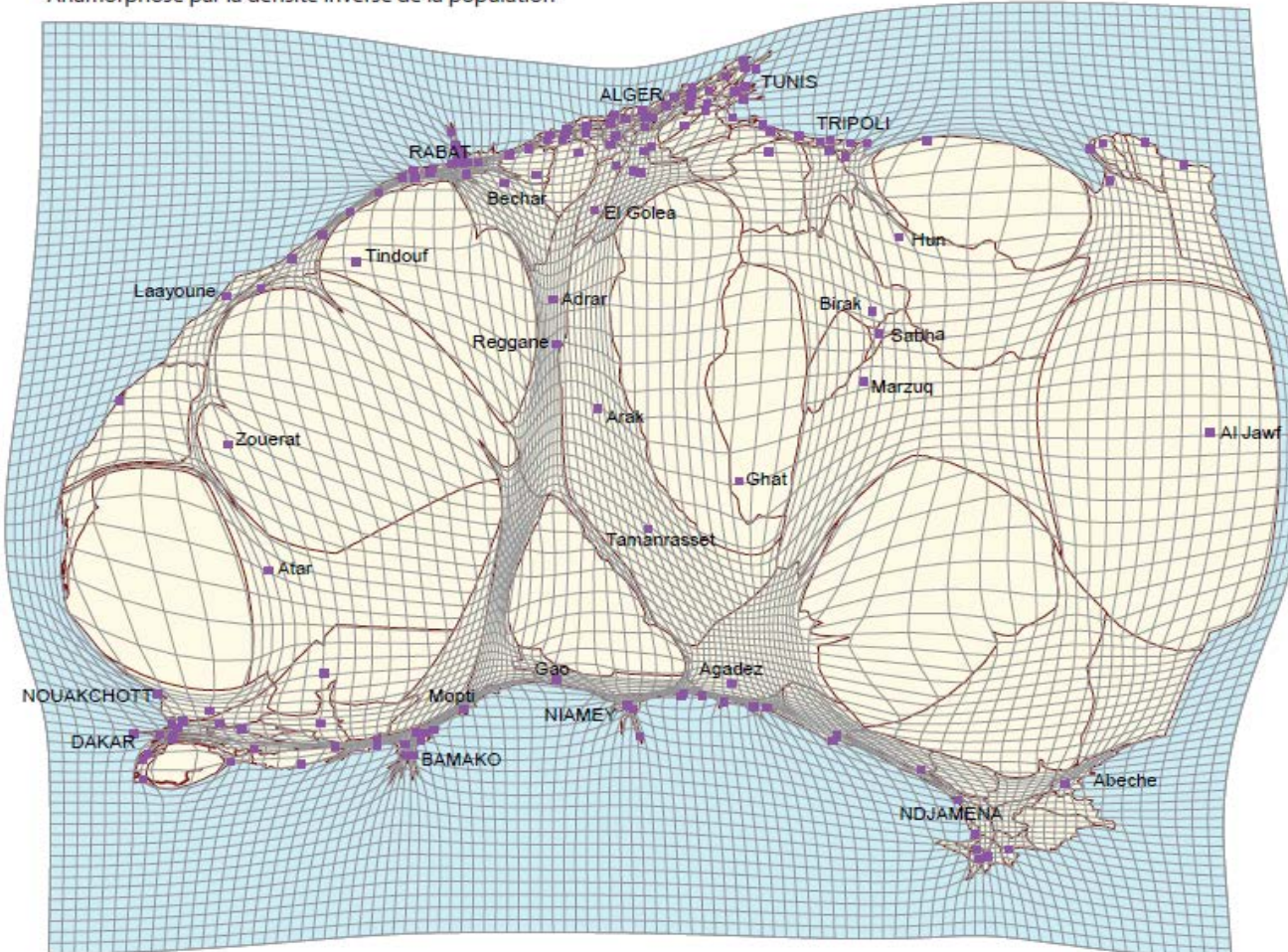

Anamorphose par la densité inverse de la population

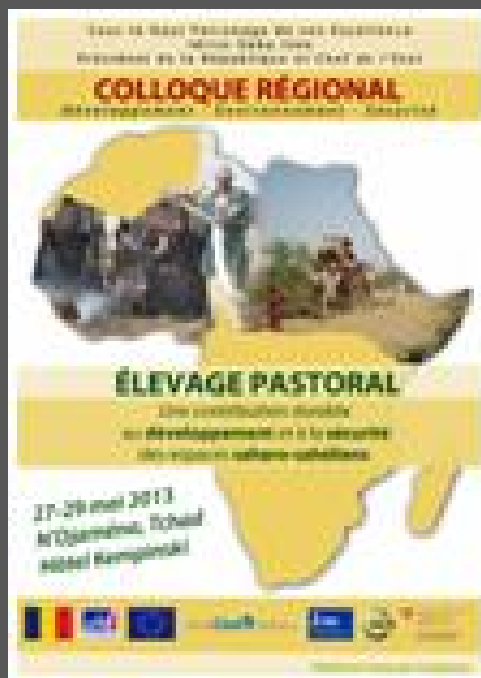

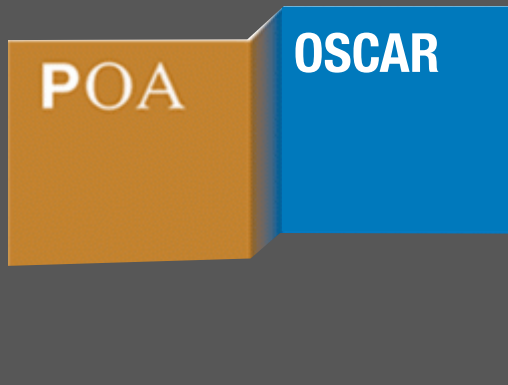

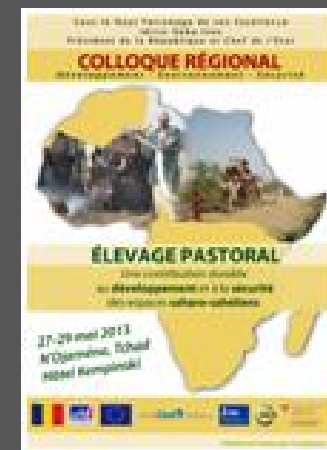

DIRECTOR'S EDITORIAL

After the war...

The "War of the Sahel" may be one of the major events of the 2010s. A decade after the September 11 attacks, the international conflict that has just begun in Mali (Mooket, in fact, the entire Saharo-Sahelian belt, from the Atlantic to the Red Sea. No matter what the modalities, this global conflict is likely to last, and half of West Africa is directly threatened by it. To free the area from the rampant criminal organisations that feed off drug trafficking, hostage taking, arms trade, human trafficking and cigarette smuggling, there is no other option than regional solidarity.

The concern is not just about the spill throughout the region, or the fight of some of northern Mali into neighbouring countries: the geographical reconstitution of the circulation and are sustained by terrorist groups for drugs and other contraband are all themselves.






However, West African solidarity has been ineffective if it is not supported by international co-operation. It is unclear - and in some circumstances the terrorist threat is the originator and developed within the coast and sub-Saharan Africa, it is a common perspective. North African countries will have to "Sahel war" - not only because the "Sahel" of their territory has also because they run the risk of Islamist and criminals tightening their vice on them.

The Club is not the place where military strategies are discussed. Rather it is a space for dialogue where it is possible to have long reflections on the past, present and uncertain. To this end and at the request of the Club, the SWAC Secretariat proposes to approach this pre-reflection from the perspective of relations between West and North Africa.

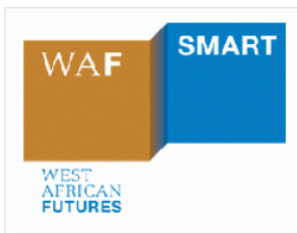
