Co-organised by the Sahel and West Africa Club, the European Union and the Global Network Against Food Crises. For the third consecutive year, the countries of the Sahel and West Africa are facing a food and nutrition crisis of exceptional proportions. Hunger and malnutrition could affect 38.3 million people by June if appropriate measures are not taken. Countries in central Sahel and the Lake Chad basin are by far the most affected. This situation is a result of long-term structural issues including poverty, a lack of availability and access to basic social services and chronic insecurity. Recent socio-economic shocks, extreme weather events, the impacts of Covid-19 and the war in Ukraine are all exacerbating the food and nutrition situation.

In order to respond effectively to the current emergency and in the search for sustainable responses to these multifaceted, recurrent food and nutrition crises, the Sahel and West Africa Club, the European Union and the Global Network Against Food Crises are co-organising a high-level consultation with the region's partners from the international community.

This event has two objectives:

→ Mobilise emergency food and nutrition assistance for the most affected populations in the Sahel and Lake Chad Basin countries (Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Nigeria and Chad), which account for 92% of the people affected by the food and nutrition crisis.

→ Renew strong political commitment to implement policies addressing the underlying

implement policies addressing the underlying causes of the food and nutrition crises, integrating humanitarian, development and peace dimensions. This will include rethinking and reinvigorating efforts to build the resilience and recovery capacities of those most vulnerable to shocks affecting their food security.

An immediate response commensurate with the scale of the crisis is crucial. States and partners are urged to respond to this ambition by making (i) substantial pledges of financial commitments to manage the food and nutrition emergency and (ii) long-term political commitments.
