Section I – TIN Description			
<p>In Liechtenstein the domestic correspondent to the TIN is referred to as the “PEID Nummer”, which is the acronym for <i>Personenidentifikationsnummer</i> and is used by individuals and entities. It is up to twelve digits long and consists exclusively of numerals. It might be that a specific PEID number is only seven or four digits long, but that happens due to the fact that the first digits are omitted in case they are the numeral zero.</p>
