About the OECD Water Governance Initiative

The <u>OECD Water Governance Initiative</u> (WGI) is an international multi-stakeholder network of 100+ delegates from public, private and not-for-profit sectors gathering twice a year in a **Policy Forum** to share experience on reforms, projects, lessons and good practices in support of better governance in the water sector.

The WGI, which was created in March 2013, has the following objectives:

- Provide a multi-stakeholder technical platform to share knowledge, experience and best practices on water governance across levels of government;
- Advise governments in taking the needed steps for effective water reforms through peer-to-peer dialogue and stakeholder engagement across public, private and non-profit sectors;
- Provide a consultation mechanism to raise the profile of governance in the Global Water Agenda;
- Support the implementation of the OECD Principles on Water Governance in interested member and non-member countries by scaling up best practices and using the indicator framework for self-assessment; and
- Foster continuity on governance between World Water Forums.

Objectives of the 17th WGI Meeting

- Update delegates on the WGI's contribution to global agendas.
- Share knowledge and experience on the latest water governance research and policy reforms.
- Discuss the 2022-2024 WGI Strategy and Programme of Work.
- Contribute to the United Nations 2023 Water Conference, in particular its track on local governments.
